

The Utah Cancer Control Program (UCCP) is a federally funded program to screen eligible women for breast and cervical cancer using mammograms and pap tests. These services are free of charge to eligible women who meet age and income criteria. Eligible women must have an income at 250% or below the federal poverty level (see below for updated guidelines), and must be uninsured or under insured.

Who we serve:

- Women between the ages of 40-64 for all eligible services.
- Women 21-39 are eligible for a Pap test if they have never had a pap or it has been 10 years since their last pap.
- Women 65+ years who are not eligible for, nor enrolled in, Medicare Part B.

The free screening services include:

- Clinical Breast Exam (CBE)
- Pap test
- Mammogram
- Diagnostic services for abnormal results
- Treatment referral for breast or cervical cancer and pre-cancerous conditions

Income Determination Information:

- When determining the client's income limit, the household size used will include their spouse and children living in the home through the month the child turns 19.
- If no income is reported, ask how the client is meeting their living expenses. If they live with someone else who pays all living expenses for them, there is no countable income unless someone gives the client money (and they have control over how it is spent).
- Alimony is countable.
- Child support is not countable.
- Food stamps are not countable as income.
- If the spouse lives away for work, it will be considered a "temporary absence" and his/her income will be included.
- If a child less than age 19 lives away for college or other reasons, and is being supported by the household, it will be considered a "temporary absence" and will be counted as part of the household size.
